LOCKOUT/TAGOUT WRITTEN PROGRAM

Management must choose to lead the safety program for it to be successful!

•OSHA standard 1910.147 (Control of Hazardous Energy) requires all employers to provide protection for employees performing maintenance and servicing on equipment or machines from the accidental start up or release of energy which could result in an employee being injured.

REMEMBER! Observe, Evaluate, Record, Review, and Correct!

EMPLOYERS MUST HAVE A WRITTEN LOTO PROGRAM WHICH INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:

- THE WRITTEN PROGRAM MUST BE SIGNED AND DATED AND REVIEWED ANNUALLY.
- ANY REVISIONS TO THE PROGRAM MUST BE NOTED DATED AND SIGNED BY THE INITIATOR OF THE CHANGE
- THE WRITTEN PROGRAM MUST BE LOCATED IN AN EASILY ACCESSABLE LOCATION.
- THE WRITTEN PROGRAM MUST BE REVIEWED DURING ANNUAL TRAINING
